



Day 1 of On the Case is in the books!
We talked about the four different types
of soil in Jesus' parable of the sower.

Here was the Big Idea: Spending time with God is how we grow.



LUKE 8:4-15

If the seeds represent God's words, or what's written in the Bible, then the different soils must be talking about our hearts.

So, if our hearts are like Exhibit A, the path, that's like someone who has a hard heart. They hear God's words, but they don't sink in. It's almost like the words bounce off of their hard hearts . . . like how a seed that falls onto the path would probably bounce a few times.

Someone with a heart like Exhibit B, the rocky ground, would really like what they're hearing from God's word at first, but they don't try to know more. So, their understanding of God isn't strong enough to stand the test of time.

And Exhibit C — the thorns. People with this kind of heart hear God's words, but start to ignore God and give all their attention to other things.



So, Exhibit D — the good soil — was where all the crops grew. That's because it was the perfect environment for a seed to make deep roots and grow into a big plant!

So, if our hearts are like the good soil, that must mean we are taking in God's words, letting them sink in, doing what we can to practice what we hear, and therefore, growing in our relationship with God.

It's all about spending time with God.

That's it! I love God, but I have been wondering how I can grow my faith...that is, get closer to God.

Have you ever thought about jumping into the pool in the summer sun? Did you think it would help you grow?

Plants need sun and water... so we should grow too right?


It didn't work. Have you tried drinking lots and lots of milk..... that only resulted in a bad stomach ache.
