- Listening Game

No additional supplies are needed for this activity. Say, "Today we are going to play a game where we will all need to listen carefully. I'm going to give some different clues, each of which will prompt you to do a different action."

1. If I clap twice, that means you get to act like an animal of your choice.
2. If I snap three times, you get to start doing jumping jacks.
3. If I stomp my foot on the ground twice, find a chair and sit in it.

Alternate giving your family members different cues, starting slow and then getting faster. You could repeat cues back to back to make it more challenging. When you're done playing, discuss: "What was the hardest part about listening to the cues? How does it make you feel to know that God may speak to us in different ways?"
