God Keeps His Promise

Luke 1:26-56; Matthew 1:18-25

Glitter Dough

Gather a rolling pin, angel cookie cutters, glitter and some play dough. (Find a great homemade recipe <u>HERE</u>) Knead the glitter into the play dough. Say, "Today in the Big God Story we heard how God sent an angel to give some very exciting news. We're going to use the play dough to make shapes of angels." Take your child through the process of rolling the dough and cutting out the shape.

Angel Handiwork

Gather scissors, glue, white paint, blue construction paper and print the Angel Shapes Template <u>HERE</u> (or draw your own). Have wet wipes nearby. Say, "In The Big God Story we learned how God sent an angel to give Mary and Joseph some very important news. Today we're going to make our own angels. We'll make the wings with our own handprints." Show the children how to glue the triangle angel body and the circle angel face onto the blue paper. Then, have the children dip their hands in the white paint and stamp them on either side of the triangle to create wings. Use the wet wipes to clean the children's hands.

Angel, Angel, What Do You See?

No additional materials are needed for this activity. Say, "We're going to play a game that is similar to I Spy. I'm going to pick something in the room and give you clues so you can guess it." Have your family ask you, "Angel, angel, what do you see?" You respond, "I see something..." (give a clue that describes the item.). Take turns guessing and then choose someone else to be the angel.
